Scriptures Ezekiel 37:1-14 (NIV)

The Valley of Dry Bones

- ¹ The hand of the LORD was on me, and he brought me out by the Spirit of the LORD and set me in the middle of a valley; it was full of hones
- ² He led me back and forth among them, and I saw a great many bones on the floor of the valley, bones that were very dry.
- ³ He asked me, "Son of man, can these bones live?" I said, "Sovereign LORD, you alone know."
- ⁴Then he said to me, "Prophesy to these bones and say to them, 'Dry bones, hear the word of the LORD!
- ⁵ This is what the Sovereign LORD says to these bones: I will make breath enter you, and you will come to life.
- ⁶ I will attach tendons to you and make flesh come upon you and cover you with skin; I will put breath in you, and you will come to life. Then you will know that I am the LORD.'"
- ⁷So I prophesied as I was commanded. And as I was prophesying, there was a noise, a rattling sound, and the bones came together, bone to bone.
- ⁸I looked, and tendons and flesh appeared on them and skin covered them, but there was no breath in them.
- ⁹ Then he said to me, "Prophesy to the breath; prophesy, son of man, and say to it, 'This is what the Sovereign LORD says: Come, breath, from the four winds and breathe into these slain, that they may live.'"
- ¹⁰ So I prophesied as he commanded me, and breath entered them; they came to life and stood up on their feet—a vast army.
- ¹¹ Then he said to me: "Son of man, these bones are the people of Israel. They say, 'Our bones are dried up and our hope is gone; we are cut off.'
- ¹² Therefore prophesy and say to them: 'This is what the Sovereign LORD says: My people, I am going to open your graves and bring you up from them; I will bring you back to the land of Israel.
- ¹³ Then you, my people, will know that I am the LORD, when I open your graves and bring you up from them.
- ¹⁴ I will put my Spirit in you and you will live, and I will settle you in your own land. Then you will know that I the LORD have spoken, and I have done it, declares the LORD.'"

Acts 2:1-21 (NIV)

The Holy Spirit Comes at Pentecost

- ¹ When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place.
- ² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting.
- ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them.

- ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.
- ⁵ Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven.
- ⁶ When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken.
- ⁷ Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans?
- ⁸Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language?
- ⁹ Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia,
- ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome
- ¹¹ (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!"
- ¹² Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"
- ¹³ Some, however, made fun of them and said, "They have had too much wine."

Peter Addresses the Crowd

- ¹⁴ Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: "Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say.
- ¹⁵ These people are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning!
- ¹⁶ No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel:
- ¹⁷ "'In the last days, God says,
- I will pour out my Spirit on all people.
- Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams.
- ¹⁸ Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy.
- ¹⁹ I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and billows of smoke.
- ²⁰ The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord.
- ²¹ And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.'
