Gospel

Luke 4:1-15

4 Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, ² where for forty days he was tempted^[a] by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of them he was hungry.

- ³The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread."
- ⁴Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man shall not live on bread alone.'[b]"
