

## First Presbyterian Church History

The Questions from the January 4, 2026 bulletin and the Answers:

**Q #1:** Who supplied the impetus for establishing a protestant church in Cody?

**A.** 23 April 1905 > After a thorough canvass of the town, Julia Goodman invited all ladies interested in Presbyterianism to meet with her in the Irma Hotel Parlors. The result of this meeting was the organization of the Ladies Society (forerunner of P.W.). Six months later, while the men of the church were presenting their 25 signatures to the Presbyterian Spring meeting in Rawlins, the Women's Society had already been at work for months stitching aprons for sale to finance a church building.

**Q #2:** Why is our church Presbyterian, rather than Congregational?

**A.** Rev. Mr. Henry W. Bainton (on horseback) won the race in October, 1905, from Cheyenne to Cody, against the Congregationalist's Wyoming Mission Wagon, thereby securing the right to establish a Presbyterian church in Cody, with the agreement that the Congregationalists would not pursue planting a church in Cody.
