# Isaiah 54:2-5 (NIV)

<sup>2</sup> "Enlarge the place of your tent, stretch your tent curtains wide, do not hold back; lengthen your cords, strengthen your stakes. <sup>3</sup> For you will spread out to the right and to the left; your descendants will dispossess nations and settle in their desolate cities. <sup>4</sup> "Do not be afraid; you will not be put to shame. Do not fear disgrace; you will not be humiliated. You will forget the shame of your youth and remember no more the reproach of your widowhood. <sup>5</sup> For your Maker is your husband the Lord Almighty is his name the Holy One of Israel is your Redeemer; he is called the God of all the earth.

## Psalm 68:4-11 (NIV)

<sup>4</sup> Sing to God, sing in praise of his name, extol him who rides on the clouds; rejoice before him—his name is the Lord. <sup>5</sup> A father to the fatherless, a defender of widows, is God in his holy dwelling. <sup>6</sup> God sets the lonely in families, he leads out the prisoners with singing; but the rebellious live in a sun-scorched land. <sup>7</sup>When you, God, went out before your people, when you marched through the wilderness, <sup>8</sup> the earth shook, the heavens poured down rain, before God, the One of Sinai, before God, the God of Israel. <sup>9</sup> You gave abundant showers, O God; you refreshed your weary inheritance. <sup>10</sup> Your people settled in it, and from your bounty, God, you provided for the poor. <sup>11</sup>The Lord announces the word, and the women who proclaim it are a mighty throng:

# Romans 14:1-13 (NIV)

<sup>1</sup>Accept the one whose faith is weak, without quarreling over disputable matters. <sup>2</sup> One person's faith allows them to eat anything, but another, whose faith is weak, eats only vegetables. <sup>3</sup> The one who eats everything must not treat with contempt the one who does not, and the one who does not eat everything must not judge the one who does, for God has accepted them. <sup>4</sup> Who are you

to judge someone else's servant? To their own master, servants stand or fall. And they will stand, for the Lord is able to make them stand.

<sup>5</sup> One person considers one day more sacred than another; another considers every day alike. Each of them should be fully convinced in their own mind. <sup>6</sup> Whoever regards one day as special does so to the Lord. Whoever eats meat does so to the Lord, for they give thanks to God; and whoever abstains does so to the Lord and gives thanks to God. <sup>7</sup> For none of us lives for ourselves alone, and none of us dies for ourselves alone. <sup>8</sup> If we live, we live for the Lord; and if we die, we die for the Lord. So, whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord. <sup>9</sup> For this very reason, Christ died and returned to life so that he might be the Lord of both the dead and the living.

<sup>10</sup> You, then, why do you judge your brother or sister? Or why do you treat them with contempt? For we will all stand before God's judgment seat. <sup>11</sup> It is written:

"'As surely as I live,' says the Lord,

'every knee will bow before me;

every tongue will acknowledge God.""

<sup>12</sup> So then, each of us will give an account of ourselves to God.

<sup>13</sup> Therefore let us stop passing judgment on one another. Instead, make up your mind not to put any stumbling block or obstacle in the way of a brother or sister.
